COVID 19 UPDATE

Kia ora koutou,

This is the latest of the Covid updates this term. These have generally been on Fridays unless it has been necessary to provide our community with immediate information. These updates will continue for the remainder of this term as we work through the Omicron situation. We have had another busy week at Kilbirnie School, the atmosphere around the kura remains calm and engaged. We continue to manage the impacts of Omicron without significant disruption to our operations to date. There continue to be no new occasions during which a student is likely to have been infectious with Covid 19 while at school. Currently we have no staff isolating as household contacts or having tested positive.

There are two main reasons for Kilbirnie School students being absent at the moment. We have students isolating at home because a household member has tested positive for Covid. We also have students who have presented with cold-like symptoms and are monitoring these while isolating at home. Students continue to return to school after their isolation period. Distance learning has been available for students who have been isolating but not unwell.

I would like to thank whānau for continuing to keep students at home if they have symptoms. I can't overstate the importance of this. If any symptoms develop, keep your child at home until they receive a negative result, AND until the child is symptom free for at **least 48 hours.** Please also:


- Wear a face mask at all times when on the Kilbirnie School grounds.
- Minimise visits to school. Don't enter the Matairangi or Whātaitai hubs unless absolutely necessary.

At Kilbirnie School:

- Our focus is on the health and wellbeing of our children, staff and community
- We are staying open unless we are eventually unable to safely staff the school.
- We are using public health measures to reduce the risk in our settings, including hygiene practises, masks, physical distancing and ventilation.
- We have appropriate cleaning procedures in place.
- We are also committed to maintaining quality teaching and learning for our students.
- Homeroom and where possible extracurricular programmes are operating well as usual.

TEACHER ONLY DAY- FRIDAY APRIL 1ST.

The Kāhui Ako teacher only day will go ahead on Friday April 1st. This bi-cultural hui, involving 13 schools from across the Eastern Suburbs, was postponed last year. We have recently worked through amendments to the programme to allow this day to proceed without bringing staff from the different schools together in person. The hui will operate online.

Therefore, please note that: Kilbirnie School will be closed on Friday April 1st.

• LEARNING CONFERENCES.

Earlier this term we offered parents an opportunity to meet with classroom teachers to learn about classroom and hub programmes. We also offered parents the opportunity to meet individually with the classroom teacher and provide information about their child. These meetings were all held online due to Covid 19. This year we are going to hold the first round of learning conferences involving the teacher, the student and their whānau in week 2 of next term. These are generally held in the last week of term 1. This means there may be the potential to hold the meetings in person which is our preference for learning conferences. This will depend on the Covid 19 situation at the time. If necessary these meeting will be held online.

• KILBIRNIE SCHOOL DONATION.

Each year we request a voluntary, tax deductible donation from the families of Kilbirnie School. As a state funded school, we receive an operations grant from the government. As we are a Decile 10 school we receive the lowest amount of operational funding per student that is available. We are also ineligible for the government "no donation" scheme which applies to decile 1-7 schools only. The amount we receive from the government is quite simply insufficient to allow us to offer the quality, broad-based curriculum that we aim to provide for the students of Kilbirnie School. Donation letters came home recently.



• CARE VALUES.
