

#### SCHOOL SWIMMING POOL- AVAILABLE THIS MONDAY NOVEMBER 28<sup>TH</sup>.

We will again offer pool keys to members of our school community this summer. These will be available to parents of Kilbirnie School students through the school office from this **Monday November 28<sup>th</sup>**. Any remaining keys will be available for members of the wider community to hire from **Monday December 5<sup>th</sup>**. Keys will not be available for hire after school closes at 1pm on **Thursday December the 15<sup>th</sup>**. If you hired a key last season, please return this to the school office as soon as possible.

The costs for the season is \$90 with a \$10 refund when the key is returned. This fee contributes to the cost of running the pool. Very little money is available from the Ministry of Education for this purpose. The school covers other costs to allow the pool to operate for our students and the community. All funds used in the 2017 redevelopment were from grants. Last year we have replaced the pool cover and added outside matting, new security lighting and camera have also been added with a total cost of \$7500.

Allowing the pool to be used by the school community is a year by year proposition for the school. Maintaining a pool committee with sufficient members is essential. In addition, we really must have a sense of community care and protection of the pool. We ask all users to adhere strictly to the conditions of use. These have been amended for this season and are provided to all key holders. Moreover, we ask users to actively encourage others to do the same. A culture of kaitiaki or shared protection of the redeveloped facility will make it more likely that the pool will be available for public use going forward. If you notice people in the pool complex very late in the evening please call the police and report this trespass. The pool closes at 8pm each evening.





#### GARDEN TO TABLE.

Garden to Table is an exciting, integrated progarmme that helps children understand how to grow, harvest, prepare and share good, healthy food. The programme builds skills for life practical, hands-on activities. Students learn gardening and cooking skills while building awareness of the environment and the need to protect it. Absolutely consistent with the Kilbirnie School graduate profile and what we want for our students!

GTT operates on Friday mornings 9-10.30am. We have two incredible specialist teachers, Sacha and Bec, who have made the programme come to life for us.
