• KILBIRNIE SCHOOL EMERGENCY PROCEDURES.

In the last newsletter I mentioned our current review of health and safety processes and procedures related to Education Outside The Classroom (EOTC). We review our emergency procedures after every drill including the drills we conducted earlier this week. These recent drills included our procedure for reverse evacuation or lockdown. We will use this process should it become necessary to lock all students and staff within our buildings. Examples of incidences that may trigger a lockdown include a dangerous animal or suspicious person near or in the school grounds. At times schools receive advise from the police to commence a lockdown based on intelligence or their operational matters in the local area.

Staff and children also practised what to do during and then following an earthquake. As Kilbirnie School is not within a danger zone in the event of a Tsunami, our approach after an earthquake that makes it unsafe to return to the classrooms is to commence our procedure for reunification. This is where we manage the collection and return to their whānau of all students. This procedure is strictly controlled and managed by our staff and allows students to be collected by parents or those named as emergency contacts within our records. It is extremely important that these records are up to date. Please advise the office if you or anyone named as an emergency contact change contact information such as address, phone and email details.

In the event of a reverse evacuation (lockdown) or the commencement of a reunification process we will email and text parents using the following text (the text in RED are examples only):

Please do not come to the school, we will update you as soon as possible.

Attention parents and whānau: Kilbirnie School starting reunification procedure.

At 2.30pm today, August 23, Kilbirnie School began a reunification process. The reason for the reunification is that there was a strong earthquake today and we believe it is best not to return to the classrooms until they have been checked. All students are safe and being supervised in the school hall.

We would now like all students to be collected by a parent or one of the adults named as an emergency contact in our records. All students can be collected from the school hall. Please bring photo identification with you and note that students will only be released to a parent or named emergency contact. Staff outside the main entrance to the school hall will provide instructions.

• KILBIRNIE SCHOOL SPORTS REVIEW- TERM 1 AND 2- a message from Katrina.

One interesting addition to programmes in the first part of this year was to look at ways of giving children sporting opportunities outside of the school grounds. The children in Matairangi Hub had Friday afternoon sports rotations at Kilbirnie Park where they took part in Football, Cricket and Tee ball skills and games. Whātaitai Hub also used local parks to provide children with sporting opportunities. Children in Ngake and Whātaitai had lessons in the school pool and all children in the school enjoyed leisure swims when weather permitted.

Three teams of Year 5/6 students were all set to take part in Eastern Zone Football but this was cancelled due to bad weather. After school sports in term one were still very popular with 10 Floorball teams and 2 touch rugby teams. We also had a small group of keen Mini Polo players use the school pool to train in preparation for term 4 leagues. It was wonderful to see some ex Kilbirnie students coming to school to coach. Term 2 has started well with a great whole school cross country event at Hataitai Park. A team of around 30 Year 4-6 students then attended the Eastern Zone competition.

Year 4-6 students are attending weekly swimming sessions at WRAC and will have their 'Swimfest' event in week 10. Children from Ngake and Whātaitai Hubs are attending weekly sessions at Akau Tangi Sports Centre where they are learning gymnastics and ball skills. We have four basketball teams entered into the after school league at ATSC and Year 5/6 students will have the opportunity to play against other schools in the Eastern Zone later in term 2.
