Next term we have our school wide learning programme- Choosing Thursday. We have developed a wide range of activities to offer the students. We share the activities with whānau so adults can participate in a discussion with their children around their decisions, this has proven to be an interesting and useful conversation prompt for whānau.

For the first time this year the activity selection process will be trialled using an online form with a paper based option being available via the office next term. You will receive an email with a link to the form that explains the options that are available. There will be a separate email for each individual child, the form asks for the child's name.

Take some time before the end of the holidays to sit down with your child or children and complete the selections. If there are any problems or issue completing the form, catch up with your child's homeroom teacher or the office in the first week back.

We are working very hard with our team to maintain momentum with the build and progress the outdoor learning projects we have developed. The outdoor spaces are the target of the fundraising which includes the brick and Lego activity, multiple grant applications and the immense work of our Parentlink group. Again, my thanks and acknowledgement to Parentlink. Design and planning of the building and surrounds has evolved and increased in scope as the work was progressed. 


- 1. Engraved red clay bricks in the outdoor area paving.

Current and past students, parents and all whānau across the country and world, supporters of Kilbirnie School, organisations and of course all local businesses are invited.


