POOL KEYS NOW AVAILABLE FROM THE OFFICE.

Keys will not be available for hire after school closes at 1pm on **Tuesday December the 19**th

If you notice people in the pool complex very late in the evening please call the police and report trespass. The pool closes at 8pm each evening.

The cost for the season is \$90 with a \$10 refund when the key is returned. This fee contributes to the cost of running the pool. Very little money is available from the Ministry of Education for this purpose. The school covers other costs to allow the pool to operate for our students and the community.

Allowing the pool to be used by the school community is a year by year proposition for the school. Maintaining a pool committee with sufficient members is essential. In addition, we really must have a sense of community care and protection of the pool. We ask all users to adhere strictly to the conditions of use. These have been amended for this season and are provided to all key holders. Moreover, we ask users to actively encourage others to do the same. A culture of kaitiaki or shared protection of the redeveloped facility will make it more likely that the pool will be available for public use going forward.

Congratulations to **Te Aroha and Winnie** who have qualified to represent the Wellington area at the Regional athletics event. This is the top level of competition for primary school athletics.








NEW BUILDING- WHĀTAITAI HUB.
